PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

My Absence

At the end of Term three and start of Term four, I spent seven weeks working as School Education Director in Lismore. This was a valuable learning experience for myself, as it provided the opportunity to visit and support 30 schools. Some of the ideas I gathered from talking to Principals will assist in supporting the further development of our school. I would like to thank Corinne Miller, Dave and Sharon Tucker who relieved as Principal, Deputy Principal and Head Teacher English respectively. I believe everyone gained something from the experience.

Examinations

Last week was a very big week for our students with Year 12 completing their Higher School Certificate, Year 10 completing their School Certificate exams and Year 7-9 completing their Semester Two formal exams. All exams ran smoothly with special thanks for the staff and students who acted as reader writers for some of our students. These people were Deslie Bender, Robert Collier, Chloe Stubbings, Jude Wright, Alex Roffey, Charlie Taikarara, Rachel Moore and Eddy Edwards. Thank you also to Lynda Price who accepted the position of HSC and SC supervisor. Lynda was particularly impressed with the mature approach our Year 10 and 12 students took towards the exams and would like to thank all the Primary students for their good behaviour and keeping noise levels low during their breaks while the exams were in progress.

Portfolio Interviews

Next week Portfolio interviews will take place. Thank you to Mrs Maslen for her organisation and for the staff, students and parents who have volunteered to make up interview panels. All students will hopefully be well prepared for the interviews and will take it seriously. We believe this is a very valuable process for developing employability skills such as organising ability and interview technique.

Two weeks ago Year 10 participated in Mock Interviews which is an important component of the Work Education course. The interview panels were made up of community members from the Casino area. Our school is very fortunate to have received millions of dollars worth of funding to allow the construction of some excellent facilities over the next 18 months. Work has already commenced with replacement of roofs and gutters and renovation of some existing rooms. The new Science Centre commences in the next few weeks, the Multi Purpose Centre upgrade commences by the end of the year and a new trade training facility commences by the middle of next year. New landscaping plans for the school have commenced to beautify the school and replace many of the trees which have been removed. We are hoping to have all work completed by the Centenary in March 2011.

Shirts for Art

During Art in the primary all students will paint at various times. All students need to have an old shirt to put over their school shirts when they do art. This will protect their school shirts from being permanently damaged. We only purchase non-toxic, water-based paint for students to use. However, as many of you are aware this paint can be very difficult to wash out of uniforms. From experience it is best to wash the paint out as soon as possible in cold water only. Once they have been washed it is almost impossible to get any further paint out.

Rewards Day

The primary rewards day is on **Friday 27th November**. We are travelling to Ballina to the Waterslides and also to Alstonville to visit 'A-Maze'n'Place'. A green note was sent home with students on Friday 13th. Students who are attending need to be at school ready to leave at **7.30 a.m.** The cost is **\$7.00 per student**. All students will need to bring recess and lunch with them on the day and be dressed in sun-smart clothes with shoes, a hat and sunscreen along with their swimmers and towels. Notes need to be returned to school by Friday 23rd November.

Our end of year concert will be held on **Monday 14th December**. Details will be sent home shortly.

P&C Report


We have been asked to hold a BBQ for the Primary Christmas concert, donations of coleslaw would be appreciated.
