PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Rural Outcomes of Schools visit

On December 1 and 2 a team of five people from throughout the Department of Education spent two days at our school meeting with staff, students, community members and parents. In addition to these meetings a number of lessons from years 7 to 9 were observed. Our school was one of four-teen schools selected across the state with the purpose of finding out what strategies and programs were being used to support the very good performances of students of recent years in NAPLAN, School Certificate and Higher School Certificate testing. The visit was a thorough study and focused on leadership structures, Aboriginal Education, Quality Teaching and community involvement. Following the two days a brief report on their findings was delivered to all staff. The team were extremely impressed with every thing they heard and saw in relation to education at this school and will deliver me a copy of their final report at the start of next year. This report will be made available for any one who is interested. I personally felt very proud of the school and would sincerely like to thank all who were involved. Well done!

Year 12 Farewell

Congratulations to all Year 12 students who completed their thirteen years of Education culminating in the Year 12 Farewell held at Bonalbo Bowling Club on November 19. Although I was unable to attend, reports from those who were there indicated that it was an excellent evening. Thank you to Eddy Edwards for chairing the evening, Ms Hillier for her organisation and for supporting Year 12 as Year adviser. Selwyn Nix our School Education Director informed me that he enjoyed the evening and the relaxed atmosphere.

Presentation Night

I would like to remind parents, carers and community members that the 2009 Presentation night ceremony will be held on Thursday December 10 in the Multipurpose Centre commencing at 7.00 pm. The majority of students and staff feel this is a very worth while process as it leads to improved skills in many areas including personal presentation, organisation, and communication. Thank you to Mrs Maslen who devoted a lot of time in to organising and coordinating the interviews and to the panel members who conducted them. Parents and carers of students who were unable to attend the interviews and have an unexplained reason for absence have been sent a letter to arrange a time for an alternative interview with myself. This is necessary to complete the academic requirements for this year and allow progression to the next scholastic year.

End of Year Activities

On Friday November 27 the majority of Primary students were provided with a rewards excursion to Ballina water slide. On Thursday December 3 all secondary boys were involved with a Boys Camp and all the Secondary girls with Girls activities at school. Between Sunday December 6 and Thursday December 10 a canoeing expedition will take place along the Nymboida and Mann rivers. These activities have not only been a lot of fun, but have provided the opportunity for our students to develop team work and other skills while experiencing a range of extra curricula activities.

This will be the last newsletter for 2009 and I wish all the school community a Happy Christmas and safe holiday. I look forward to working with you in 2010 which I am sure will be a very exciting and rewarding year.
