This term, Year 11/12 are studying architecture. We have looked at basic structures and are now studying contemporary works such as the Guggenheim Museum, Bilbao by Frank Gehry. Best wishes go to Luke Moore who will sit the trials exam on Wednesday. Luke has almost completed a collection of drawings which he will submit as his HSC Body of Work.

Year 9/10 are completing works begun last term, based on Land Art vs. Landscape Art. These include drawings, traditional prints and digital prints. When they have finished they will be making decorative paintings to be installed in the school canteen.

Nominative Determinism

Now there's a phrase you don't see so often in the School News. Someone invented it to describe the way our names sometimes describe what we do. Tom Plunge might be a high board diver; Julia Slash might be a surgeon and Teddy Try might be a footballer.

In a bold act of nominative determinism, five of our Duke of Edinburgh's Award participants decided to climb Edinburgh Castle for their Test Expedition. Edinburgh Castle is a mountain: a volcanic plug near Urbenville. It's the big one you see on the right when you get out of the Yabbra Forest and start winding down to Urbenville.

The last time Duke students from Bonalbo climbed the mountain was eighteen years ago, so Alex Roffey, Michael Tucker, Brenden Williams, Jack Cooper and Blake McCormack decided to carry a new visitors' book and protective container up the mountain to replace the old ones.

In the old days you could follow 4wd tracks to the place where the mountain really starts to get steep and then start climbing, but the area is now part of a national park and the tracks have almost disappeared under regrowth. This added an extra challenge to the boys' trip. All drinking and cooking water had to be carried as well as cooking stoves and fuel. Add the incredibly steep climb and thick vegetation and you will realise that this trip was no picnic.

If the job was difficult, at least the weather was perfect: cool, dry and sunny. The boys made excellent time to the start of the climb then set their compasses and began the serious ascent. The climb was a great test of navigation skills and teamwork, not to mention cardio vascular fitness. As an indication of the difficulty, it took ten minutes to climb the first five metres.

Things weren't that much easier once the top was reached. The vegetation was incredibly thick, ranging from rainforest to eucalypt forest to just plain rock and scrub. The boys managed to locate a semi-flat grassy area for their campsite. Although the wind blew non stop all night the camp was sheltered. One small tent bulged like a bag of oranges because it had to house Blake, Jack and Brenden, but they made it through the night.

The trig marker had disappeared and the summit cairn was in a new location, so the boys installed the new visitors' book and container and spent some time reading through entries in the old visitors' books. A surprising number of people make the climb, but most do it easy travelling light and going up and down in a day. The number is bound to drop as the tracks become more overgrown.

The next morning was spent preparing gourmet breakfasts, admiring the views and looking, without success, for the missing trig marker. The trip back down the mountain was just as arduous as the ascent, but the group made it back to the access track safely. A quick lunch was gobbled at North Yabbra Forest Road, and then the boys stepped out for a quick march back to the rendezvous point, where they were met by Mrs Tucker.



For safety reasons, the group was 'shadowed' all the way by Mr Tucker, but he was not allowed to help. The boys showed great cooperation, responsibility and high spirits. Congratulations, Michael, Alex, Brenden, Blake and Jack.
