## Higher School Certificate and School Certificate Examinations.

Last week Year 12 completed their Trial Higher School Certificate examinations. We wish them well with their final preparations for the HSC proper which will commence on the 17<sup>th</sup> October.

The Minister for Education, Adrian Piccoli has recently announced that this will be the final year that the School Certificate Examinations will take place. New South Wales is the last state to abolish these exams and it is partly due to the leaving school age being recently raised to 17. A new Record of Achievement will be developed and introduced in 2012 for students who finish their schooling before completing their Higher School Certificate.
