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# PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

### Excursions

Early reports indicate that the Primary students and staff who were involved with the recent excursion to Canberra had a very educational and enjoyable time. The opportunity to travel with Coraki Public School was an added bonus as it provided a great opportunity to mix and share the experience with other students from another school. Despite the anxiety of students leaving home, I am sure all of the students involved now feel more confident in themselves and were glad they had the experience. I would like to thank Ms O'Meara, Mrs Ludwig, Mrs Whitney and Mr Woods for accompanying the students. Details of the excursion are found later in this newsletter.

Last Saturday night, I farewelled a number of our secondary students and Ms Ellis, who boarded the train at Casino to travel to Jindabyne for, hopefully, a great week's skiing. Mr Muller, who has been marking the Higher School Certificate Design and Technology Projects, joined the group in Sydney to travel by bus for the second part of the journey. At this stage I have had no report on how the skiing has been, but I am sure they will be having a good time.

### Multipurpose Centre (MPC) and Sport Visit

After more than 18 months of planning and construction the Multipurpose Centre was handed over for use last week. On Friday, our secondary students made full use of the facility with basketball and netball matches being played against Woodenbong Central School. In addition to that, two Rugby League matches were played on the school oval. The day was a great success due to the good sportsmanship shown by all players and the great organisation and support provided by staff and students. Special thanks to Mr Flannery for his organisation of the day.

Next week the MPC will get further use with a concert on Wednesday September 21 beginning at 7.00 pm and a sports assembly on Thursday September 22, with both providing an opportunity to try out the new stage. The sports assembly will commence at 2.30 pm and all Parents and Carers are invited to attend both events.

### Water Tank Grant

With the MPC now completed, 4 X 22,000 litre water tanks will be installed at the northern end of the MPC. This has been possible through a grant which was provided from the Federal Government. This water will be used to water vegetable gardens in the Primary, the Agriculture plot and enable some irrigation of the school oval and Primary play area.

#### **School Captains**

With Year 12 about to complete their formal time at school, we have decided to elect new Secondary School Captains and Vice Captains who will now commence their duties next term. Interviews with the Principal and Year Adviser have taken place along with a speech from each candidate to the students. Voting will take place next week and the new Captains and Vice Captains will be announced at the sports assembly next Thursday, September 22.

### School Exams

Next week, Year 11 will sit for their yearly exams and Year 10 will undertake their trial School Certificate exams. Year 11 will also commence their Higher School Certificate courses next term while Year 10 will be the last group to ever sit the external School Certificate exams in Week 5. We wish all students the best of luck with their preparations.
