We recently had a departmental audit of various systems and processes within the school. We are pleased with the findings and have already begun to enact some of the recommendations to improve our practice and ensure compliance. One area that was examined was student attendance. It is crucial that students attend each day, unless sick or have an appointment or pressing family matter. Parents/carers must provide an explanation for <u>all absences</u> including early departure and late arrival (just saying "I'm late" is not a reason). This can be done via phone call, note or coming into the office to provide a reason. **Students can no longer be dropped at the front gate if they are**

KYOGLE WRITERS FESTIVAL

14th-16th MAY

The inaugural Kyogle Writers Festival kicks off on Friday 14 May and runs through until Sunday 16. More than 40 authors are attending: speaking on their works in conversations; participating in panel discussions; running workshops; reading their poetry.

The Festival has attracted highly acclaimed authors including Melissa Lucashenko, whose novel, *Too Much Lip*, earned her the Miles Franklin Award for literature in 2019; Stuart Rees, founder of the Sydney Peace Foundation, will be discussing his latest book, *Cruelty or Humanity: Challenges, Opportunities and Responsibilities* and former ABC journalist (7.30; Foreign Correspondent), Scott Bevan, will talk about the set of three non-fiction books he has written while kayaking on Sydney Harbour, Hunter River and Lake Macquarie.

With the theme of 'Country', topics to be explored include how local histories shape country; First Nations writing; writing about place; writing in the face of a collapsing climate; and Australian women's fiction. There are also workshops on songwriting, podcasting, writing young adult fiction, and self-publishing. The full programme is available on the website (details given below).

The festival consists of more than 40 separate events, some are free, others are ticketed, with prices starting at \$10.00. Tickets can be purchased online through the festival website, at the Kyogle Farmers Market on Saturday 8 May or at the Festival Box Office in Stratheden Street during the Festival.
