#### **Excerpt from Principal's address at Presentation Assembly**

#### **RRISK**

In Week 6, Year 11 students participated in RRISK: Reduce Risk, Increase Student Knowledge. These daily two-hour online seminars involved presentations on how to look after yourself and your friends when celebrating and partying. The keynote speaker, Paul Dillon, provided information and dispelled myths about alcohol and other drugs. Christine McKenna from the NRMA talked about preventative behaviours to reduce the risk of accidents and Sara Gloede shared her personal experience of road trauma. Before participating in the RRISK seminars, students completed the "Save a Mate" training where we practised what to do in an emergency, calling for help and placing someone in the recovery position. These were all valuable life lessons that we hope our students never have to use but this program, as part of their mandatory Life Ready course, ensures they will be prepared and able to stay safe and help someone if





#### **Year 7 2023 Transition**

As part of our Year 6 – 7 transition program, Mrs Taylor and then Ms Lee visited our local primary schools to meet with parents and students to plan for orientation days and transition to high school in 2023. Year 6 students from Drake and Tabulam Public Schools, as well as Bonalbo Central, attended Bonalbo Central School on Tuesday 29<sup>th</sup> November and Thursday 1<sup>st</sup> December to enjoy a range of secondary lessons including Food Technology, where students iced cakes and made milkshakes with Ms Ducat and the Year 12 Hospitality students. Ms Ducat also talked to the students about the opportunities they will have to study Agriculture next year and beyond. They spent time in the workshop doing Wood Technology with Mr Muller and senior Timber students. They also worked with Ms Blunt on Digital



Technology, in the Science lab with Mr Anderson doing experiments and learnt about Geography with Ms Taylor. Mr Kilroy shared some funs PDHPE games in the MPC. Aboriginal Studies, History and English were included with Mrs White. These orientation days provided valuable learning experiences to prepare our incoming Year 7 students for what to expect as well as meet and get to know some of their new classmates and teachers. Feedback from students was overwhelmingly positive, showing they are keen and ready for high school. We continue to plan for Year 7 2023 with Mrs White as their Stage Advisor, who is organising a camp for Week 5 Term 1.



# **Food Technology & Hospitality**

#### **CWA Land Cookery Competition**

Stage 5 and Year 8 Food Technology classes had the opportunity to enter The Land Cookery Competition run by the Bonalbo CWA. Our students entered tea cakes in the junior competitors' section and were highly praised by the CWA judges for the quality of their cakes. Congratulations to Keeley and Erin who won 1st prize, and Aimee and Tess who were awarded 2nd prize in the simple tea cake category. It was amazing to see students getting involved and having fun while applying skills they have learnt in class. A big thankyou to the Bonalbo CWA for supporting our students and giving them the opportunity to put their cooking skills to good use outside of the classroom.









#### Barista Course

Year 11 Hospitality students, along with Ms Ducat and Mrs Armfield, had the opportunity to develop their barista skills by undertaking a Basic Barista Course at Wollongbar TAFE. Students learnt skills such as how to properly pull espresso shots and froth milk, giving them real-world experiences and a head start on the espresso coffee unit they will complete in Year 12 next year while working towards a Certificate II in Hospitality. The course was a great opportunity for students to broaden their skills within an industry environment and an amazing time was had by all.





#### **Ag Team**

This year, the Bonalbo Central Ag Team busily prepared and showed a number of cattle to take to local shows and school events. Loclin, Katja, Lilly, Tyrone, Layne, Jason, Aimee, Chloe, Georgina and Charlie made themselves and their school extremely proud with their efforts. We took part in a number of shows including Bonalbo Show, Casino Beef Week, Glen Innes Beef Extravaganza, Lismore Show, and the Northern Schools Steer Comp. Students also participated in several workshops learning how the prepare, lead and feed the cattle to achieve the best results.

We came away with a number of ribbons at various events:

Glen Innes Beef Extravaganza - Tuff placed 3<sup>rd</sup> in weight class and 2<sup>nd</sup> over the hook while Tank received a highly commended.

Lismore Show - Troy placed  $4^{th}$  in his weight class,  $2^{nd}$  in over the hook in the school section and  $1^{st}$  over the hook in the open class. Terry placed  $5^{th}$  in the school led steers,  $3^{rd}$  over the hook in the school section and  $4^{th}$  in the open section. The stud heifers came  $2^{nd}$  and  $3^{rd}$  and received reserve champion.

#### **History**

Year 7 History investigated Ancient Rome in Term 3. Students explored the everyday life of the people of this time and how many of the inventions, political ideas and architecture is still evident today. We took a virtual tour of the colosseum that showed us how the many different events took place. In Term 4, we studied different aspects of Ancient China. Students were impressed with the many castles of China and built their own using Minecraft or cardboard.

Year 8 History delved into the world of Shogunate Japan and enjoyed learning about the samurai warriors and the feudal system of that time. In Term 4, students learnt about Australian Aboriginal and American Indian resistance to and impact of colonisation on these First Nations Peoples. Of particular interest was the warrior,



Pemulwuy, who fought for 12 years against the British in the first years of colonisation.

During Term 3, Stage 5 History students explored changes in everyday living after WW2. Students were exposed to a world of rock'n'roll dancing and music, along with the major shift in the music industry and how many songs were part of the protest movement of the 60s and 70s. In Term 4, we investigated how Australia became involved in the Vietnam War. Students debated the need for conscription and studied the different perspectives of the people involved in the war.

In Term 4, our students have enjoyed visits from Police Citizens Youth Club team. Shayne (Aboriginal Liaison Officer) and Jay (Police and Youth Engagement Officer) brought out a range of fitness equipment to share and mentor our students. Stage 3 and 4 students participated in physical challenges including boxing, fitness tests, weights and games, as well as team building activities and resilience discussions.
