Some important reminders

Secondary students are required to bring all necessary equipment to support their learning – this includes pens, pencils, books etc. Food and water are also required for students to stay focused on learning. Please contact the office if you need another copy of the stationery requirements.

Correct uniform is to be worn by all students. Tops for secondary and tops, pants and hats for primary are available from the office. Please contact the office if you need another copy of the uniform expectations.

Secondary students are expected to put their phones into their allocated YONDR Pouch each morning. Failure to do so may result in suspension as per our mobile phone policy. Primary students are not to have any electronic devices at school. They are to hand in any items to the front office on arrival for collection at the end of the day. Please contact the school if you need another copy of the policy.

For everyone's safety, please support us to keep our school free of the following items, which are banned from NSW public schools:

- Aerosol spray cans deodorant etc.
- Chewing gum
- Energy drinks, soft drinks
- Alcohol
- Tobacco, cigarettes
- Vapes (e-cigarettes)
- Illegal drugs and restricted substances
- Weapons, including knives

Students found with or using these prohibited items at school may receive a suspension. This includes possession and/or use of such items at bus stops, on the bus or on excursions and camps.

Schools are "hands-off" environments. This includes overt physical contact between students in a relationship along with aggressive, violent touching of any kind: pinching, punching, pushing, slapping, kicking etc. are not permitted and may result in suspension. We allow team games and touch football to be played at break times and it must be just that – touch only, not tackle. All PE and Sport activities are to be undertaken with care and adherence to the rules, and students are expected to demonstrate being safe and respectful at all times.

It is a legal requirement to explain all student absences. This includes late arrivals and early departures. Contact can be made via reply text to the school's SMS, School Stream app, phone call (6665 1205) or in person at the office.
