


What a great night!


Year 3-6 Camp

Students had a fun experience participating in the Bear Grylls Survival Academy, working together to complete outdoor challenges.


































What a place to be on a hot day! Thank you to the Darlington Beach Holiday Resort for a wonderful stay. The students had a blast.








K-2 Summerland Farm Excursion

Primary Swimming Program


The primary school swimming program was another highlight this term. The program aims to build confidence and skills in the water as well as basic skills in water safety and survival. Submerging to collect items, floating with flotation devises, kicking on front and back and safe entry into the water are all basic skills taught to emerging swimmers. As the children progress through the program, they learn to float without devices, to tread water and learn about water safety, including helping others without putting themselves at risk. Strokes including freestyle, backstroke and backstroke are taught to children when they are ready. The important SLIP, SLOP, SLAP, SEEK AND SLIDE message is also included to encourage sun safety.
